



SECTION I



CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I:

NAME

This Fellowship shall be called the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship.

ARTICLE II:

MEMBERSHIP

This Fellowship in session shall be composed of three (3) messengers per cooperating church with resident membership of fifty (50) or less and one (1) additional messenger for each additional fifty (50) resident members or major fraction thereof or one (1) additional messenger for each \$500 contributed through the Cooperative Program, except that no church may have more than ten (10) messengers.

ARTICLE III:

PURPOSE

Section 1. This Fellowship is a nonprofit corporation through which Southern Baptists may work harmoniously in cooperation in promoting all enterprises they deem necessary in carrying out the Great Commission.

Section 2. This Fellowship, in keeping with its stated purpose, shall not attempt to exercise control over the cooperating churches.

Section 3. This Corporation is organized, and will always operate, exclusively for religious purposes, and no part of the net earnings of this Corporation inure, or will ever inure, to the benefit of any individual or of any private shareholder, there being no shareholders. None of the income of this organization may inure to the benefits of any private individual or members and the assets of the Corporation are irrevocably dedicated to and for religious purposes, and upon dissolution of the Corporation, the Executive Board of the Corporation will cause the assets of the Corporation to be distributed, after the payment of creditors, to an organization which will use said assets exclusively for religious purposes.

ARTICLE IV:

OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of the Fellowship shall be a president, vice president, recording secretary, assistant recording secretary, and such other officers as the Fellowship may deem necessary.

Section 2. These officers shall be elected annually by a majority vote of the members present and voting at the annual meeting of the Fellowship. They shall take office at the close of the annual Fellowship meeting, and hold office until their successors are elected and installed.

Section 3. The duties of these officers shall be those usually required in similar organizations.

ARTICLE V: EXECUTIVE BOARD

The Fellowship shall elect an Executive Board as set forth in the Bylaws.

ARTICLE VI: COMMITTEES

The committees of the Fellowship shall be a Nominating Committee, Program Committee, a Committee on Committees and such other committees as are needed to carry out its work.

ARTICLE VII: MEETINGS

- Section 1. The Fellowship shall meet at such time and place as may be designated by the Fellowship at its annual meeting.
- Section 2. In an emergency the president of the Fellowship, acting in cooperation with the Executive Board, may change the time and/or place of the regular annual meeting.
- Section 3. In an emergency the president of the Fellowship, acting in cooperation with the Executive Board, may call a special meeting of the Fellowship.

ARTICLE VIII: CONTRIBUTIONS AND FUNDS

- Section 1. The Cooperative Program shall be the chief means through which the Fellowship shall support its missionary endeavors.
- Section 2. All funds of this Fellowship shall be raised by voluntary contributions, provided this does not prevent acquiring funds of property by bequest or use of any income property that may be bequeathed to or purchased by the Fellowship.
- Section 3. All designated gifts accepted by this Fellowship shall by used strictly according to the expressed will and direction of the donor.

ARTICLE IX: AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amended in the following manner:

- (1) Presenting copies of the proposed amendment(s) to the messengers while the Fellowship is in session.
- (2) Proposed amendment(s) shall lie over until the next regular meeting of the Fellowship.
- (3) Proposed amendment(s) shall require two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the messengers voting.

BYLAWS

I: TERRITORY

The territory to be served by the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship is North Dakota, South Dakota and other areas.

II: OFFICERS

Officers shall be elected annually. Officers shall be nominated from the floor and elected by ballot. The president and vice president shall be eligible to serve two (2) years in succession. Other officers may serve indefinitely.

III: EXECUTIVE BOARD

- Section 1. The Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Nominating Committee shall recommend persons to the Fellowship for election to the Executive Board.
- Section 2. The Board shall be elected to represent the total area and not as associational representatives.
- Section 3. Each association with four (4) churches and two hundred (200) resident members may have one (1) Board member, and one (1) additional Board member when they reach four hundred (400), eight hundred (800), and twelve hundred (1200) resident members. No association may have more than four (4) Board members. One (1) representative from a language congregation shall serve a three (3) year term on the Executive Board.
- Section 4. Employees of Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship shall not be eligible to serve on the Executive Board except as advisors or non voting ex-officio members. The Executive Director of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship shall serve as an advisory member and consultant to the Executive Board and all Fellowship committees.
- Section 5. Board members eligible to serve are those who have been in the Fellowship area a minimum of six (6) months and whose churches contribute at least quarterly through the Cooperative Program.
- Section 6. The term of office shall be three (3) years. Members elected to unexpired terms may serve out the term and be eligible for one (1) full term. No member shall be eligible to serve more than six (6) years until a minimum of one (1) year has elapsed. A member moving from the association from which he/she has been chosen automatically goes off the Board.
- Section 7. The Executive Board has authority to act for the Fellowship between regular meetings of the Fellowship except that it cannot impose its will on the Fellowship by rescinding or contradicting any action taken in a regular Fellowship meeting.
- Section 8. Members of the Executive Board shall be elected by the Fellowship in session upon recommendation of the Fellowship nominating committee. The Nominating Committee may receive suggestions from the associations. The Nominating Committee shall appoint persons to the Executive Board to fill vacancies on the Board until such unexpired terms are filled by action of the Fellowship at the next regular meeting of the Fellowship.

- Section 9. The president, vice president, recording secretary and assistant recording secretary of the Fellowship shall be members of the Executive Board.
- Section 10. The Executive Board shall meet at least twice a year on a date suggested by the Fellowship Director and approved by the Executive Board. Fifty percent (50%) of the Board members shall constitute a quorum at the meeting.
- Section 11. The Executive Board shall organize itself as described within the Executive Board Manual.
- Section 12. The Executive Board shall act as the authorized legal agent for the Fellowship.

IV: AGENCIES

- Section 1. The Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Nominating Committee shall recommend ministers and laity to the Fellowship to serve as directors or trustees of all agencies.
- Section 2. There shall be at least six (6) members elected to serve as directors or trustees of all agencies.
- Section 3. Elected members of all agencies shall be maintained on a rotation basis with one-third (1/3) serving a one (1) year term, one-third (1/3) serving a two (2) year term, and one-third (1/3) serving a three (3) year term.
- Section 4. The term of office for members of all agencies shall be three (3) years. No member shall serve more than six (6) years until one (1) year has elapsed.
- Section 5. Should vacancies occur on any agency, the Fellowship nominating committee shall, in consultation with the directors of trustees and committees of the agency, bring recommendations to the Executive Board to fill such vacancies until the next regular session of the Fellowship.
- Section 6. Every agency shall organize itself by the election of appropriate officers immediately following the annual meeting.
- Section 7. Every agency shall organize committees as is necessary for the fulfillment of its responsibilities and determine the authority of each committee.
- Section 8. Each member of every agency shall be a member of a Southern Baptist church which is in cooperation with the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship.

V: FELLOWSHIP EMPLOYEES

- Section 1. The Executive Board shall employ all Fellowship personnel, except office secretaries.
- Section 2. The Executive Director shall employ all office secretaries in counsel with department directors.

- Section 3. The Executive Director shall give general supervision and/or counsel to the work of the Fellowship through its departments and agencies. He shall receive and retain in the Fellowship office all historical data.
- Section 4. The Executive Director and all department directors shall present a written report of their stewardship to the Fellowship at the annual meeting.
- Section 5. The Executive Board shall contract with all employed personnel on an indefinite time basis, and a thirty-day (30) notice shall be given by either party of the desire to end the contract, except by mutual agreement.
- Section 6. The Executive Director shall serve ex-officio, without voting, on all committees, and aid by furnishing information, printed materials and needed guidance for the work of the committees.
- Section 7. There shall be a Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship policy manual setting forth all policies, procedures and practices for all Fellowship employees.

VI: COMMITTEES

- Section 1. The Committee on Committees shall consist of at least five (5) members appointed by the president of the Fellowship in consultation with the vice president of the Fellowship. This committee shall appoint the Resolutions Committee, the Time-Place-Preacher Committee, the Nominating Committee. All special committees authorized by the Fellowship shall be appointed by the President of the Committee on Committees.
- Section 2. The Nominating Committee, consisting of one representative from each association, shall be responsible for nominating persons to the Executive Board and all Fellowship agencies.
- Section 3. The Program Committee of the Fellowship shall consist of the president, the vice president, the Executive Director of the Fellowship, the host pastor, the WMU president, the Brotherhood president, and the president of the Pastor's Conference.
- Section 4. The president, vice president, and Fellowship Director shall serve as ex-officio members of all Fellowship committees of which they are not already a part.
- Section 5. Ex-officio committee members shall serve in an advisory capacity only.

VII: AMENDMENTS

The Bylaws may be amended in the following manner:

- At any regular meeting of the Fellowship except the last session.
- (2) An amendment must be presented in writing and copies made available to the messengers at either the first or second session.
- (3) Voted on at a stated time during a subsequent session.
- (4) Receive two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of those voting.

VIII:

RULES OF ORDER

The New Testament and Robert's Rule of Order Revised shall govern the conduct of the proceedings of the Fellowship, not otherwise provided for in the constitution or bylaws.

Executive Board Meeting March 14-15, 1995

The Executive Board of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship met at the Riverwood Baptist Church, Bismarck, ND, at 6:00 pm on Tuesday evening, March 14, 1995. Following a delicious meal, we divided into the two respective committees (Administrative/ Personnel and Constitution/Finance) and met in our committees the rest of the evening. At the close of the individual committee meetings, we were adjourned until 9:00 am Wednesday morning.

The Executive Board of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship was called to order at 9:00 am, Wednesday morning, March 15, 1995, at the Riverwood Baptist Church, Bismarck, ND, by DSBF President Philip Fike.

President Fike led us in a time of Prayer Requests and Concerns and prayer was offered by Preston North, DOAM, Eastern North Dakota Baptist Association.

Henry Nist led us in a time of singing, accompanying us on the guitar.

Bill Savery led us in devotional thoughts centering on Jesus' dealing with Satan.

Carl Roach introduced the following guests: Larry & Lillian Vickery, Marilyn Pope, David Bohlander, Jack Billups, Mike Merrival and Ken Clair.

Roll Call. Members present were: Roger Crowhurst, Philip Fike, Bill Savery, Tammy Kraft, Jimmy Weber, Henry Nist, Ron Rich, Ray Self, Carl Roach, Sandy Stetson, Victoria Culbertson. Staff members present were: Dewey Hickey, Harriett Hickey, John Miller, Jan Dixon, Amy Mosbrucker, Preston North, Ed Pope, Loyd Nielson and Tom Sherrill.

Dewey gave the Executive Director's report. Finances are up but no "real" growth in membership and actually a decline in Total Membership due to some churches purging their rolls. Using two Bell Curves from Robert Dale's book, <u>To Dream Again</u>, he fixed our position somewhere between "plateau" and "decline." Because the DSBF was birthed without choice, we need to go back to the "dreaming" stage.

Dewey also explained for the benefit of new board members the realities of gifts to the Cooperative Program through the DSBF. Out of the average gift per church of \$1,600, 15% or \$248 goes to the SBC; 16% or \$256 goes to match HMB funds that come back to the DSBF and \$420 goes to the Annuity board to provide benefits for those pastors who participate in the Annuity program. EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING

August 28-29, 1995

The Executive Board of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship was called to order by Chairman Carl Roach at approximately 5:00 pm at the DSBF office. Following our meal, we met as a Board for the purpose of hearing the recommendations of the Nominating Committee for new members of the Board. These new members were assigned to their respective committees. We then divided into our two committees (Administrative/Personnel and Constitution/Finance). At the close of the Committee meetings, we were adjourned until 9:00 am Tuesday morning.

The Executive Board of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship was called to order at 9:00 am, Tuesday, August 29, 1995, by Chairman Carl Roach. Ron Rich led us in a hymn "Revive Us Again" followed by a time of prayer requests and a prayer led by John Miller, Church Development Director. Guests present were introduced and Roll Call was taken.

Board members present were Roger Crowhurst, Jesse Moore, Ron Rich, Ellen Tilley, Jimmy Weber, Dave Bohlander, Tammy Kraft, Greg Larsen, Carl Roach, James Sabot, Ray Self, Phil Fike and Kent Atkinson.

Staff Members present were Dewey Hickey, John Miller, Harriett Hickey, Ed and Marilyn Pope, Loyd Nielson, Larry Vickery and Preston North.

Dewey Hickey gave the Fellowship Directors report. Referring to work by Lyle Schaller and Charles Chaney, he explained that the difference between the Fellowship living and dying is new work starts. At least 5% is needed for growth, 3% for plateau and anything less leads to death. We have been plateaued for the past two years. In order to grow we need at least 4.5 new starts each year. Our Church Planter Strategist/DOAMs have targeted 28 potential sites to begin in the next two years. Dewey introduced Dorothy Longie who is our new Volunteer Coordinator.

DOAMs Ed Pope, Preston North, Loyd Nielson and Larry Vickery gave printed reports and spoke to them. Church Development Director, John Miller, gave his printed report and spoke to it. Harriett Hickey gave her two reports: (1) *Dakota Connection* has lower printing costs but higher postage so there will only be one more edition in 1995; (2) Family Ministries have had 4 training events; the Singles Retreat drew 75 persons; there will be a Seniors Retreat next June 4-7 and a list of Seniors is needed from each church; True Love Waits-Thru the Roof rally in Sioux Falls in September with Richard Ross leading. Mary Burch was introduced as a Mission Service Corps volunteer working with Singles.

There were 233 present for our Youth Camp this year.

Constitution/Finance Committee report was given by Phil Fike, Acting Chairman.

- Recommend that housing allowance forms for DSBF staff be approved. Passed.
- Recommend approval of two Annuity Board contracts. First for Field Staff at 8%; second for Office Staff at 8%. Passed.
- Recommend that a Special Offering be taken in January March 1996 with a goal of \$3,900.00 to fund the increase in Office Staff annuity. Motion failed.

- 4. Recommend that the gift of \$31,409.83 from the estate of Everette C.  Amended budget discussed and passed.

- Recommend that the resignation of Paul Johanson, Yankton, SD, be accepted by Board. Passed.
- Letter from Pastor Bill Martin expressing concern over Annual Meeting dates in the middle of the week. Recommended that Recording Secretary send letter to Bill stating that this year's dates are set, but that it will be given consideration in setting next years dates. Passed.
- Recommend that since Lou Sherrill has resigned and the HMB has denied funding for the position, that a part-time person be used to handle paperwork in the Fellowship Office that relates to WMU work. Passed.

CONSTITUTION of the DAKOTA SOUTHERN BAPTIST FELLOWSHIP FOUNDATION

Article I. NAME

This Foundation shall be called the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Foundation.

Article II. MEMBERSHIP

The sole member of the Foundation is the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship.

Article III. PURPOSE

This Foundation is organized, and will always operate, exclusively for religious purposes, and no part of the net earning of this corporation inure, or will ever inure, to the benefit of any individual or of any private shareholder, there being no shareholders. None of the income of this organization may inure to the benefit of any private individual or members and the assets of the Foundation are irrevocably dedicated to and for religious purposes, and upon dissolution of the Foundation, all of its property and affairs shall be liquidated in such manner as deemed advisable and advantageous by the Fellowship Executive Director, the Foundation Board of Directors and the Fellowship Executive Board. Property and proceeds of such liquidation shall be turned over to the Southern Baptist Foundation of Nashville, Tennessee, or its successor, or, if there be no such successor, then to the Executive Committee of the Southern Baptist Convention.

Article IV. OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of the Foundation shall be an Executive Director, President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer.

Section 2. The Executive Director of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship shall be the Executive Director of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Foundation.

Article V. DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors of the Foundation shall be six (6) elected by the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship and serve in accordance with the Foundation ByLaws.

Article VI. FOUNDATION CONTRIBUTIONS AND FUNDS

Section 1. All restricted and unrestricted capital (corpus) funds will be raised by voluntary investments of individuals, groups, corporations, and churches. Additional funds received by the Foundation from the sale and/or use of property by bequest shall become restricted or unrestricted capital (corpus) funds. All monetary funds received by the Foundation by bequest shall become restricted or unrestricted capital (corpus) funds. Undesignated funds received shall be unrestricted capital (corpus), designated funds received shall be restricted capital (corpus).

- Section 2. All restricted capital (corpus) funds shall be invested in safe interest/dividend bearing bank accounts, Government Bonds, or Annuity Programs. All investments must be AA rating or better.
- Section 3. All unrestricted capital (corpus) if invested shall be invested in safe interest/dividend bearing bank accounts, Government Bonds, or Annuity Programs. All investments must be AA rating or better. Church loans may be authorized. The total of all church loans shall not exceed ten percent (10%) of the unrestricted capital (corpus).
- Section 4. The investment of capital funds shall be managed by the Executive Director with concurrence of the Board of Directors of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Foundation.
- Section 5. Funds from the Foundation's investments of designated investments shall be used strictly according to the expressed will and direction of the donor.
- Section 6. Funds from the Foundation's investments of undesignated investments shall be used to accomplish the stated purpose of the Foundation. Any distribution of funds recommended by the Executive Director of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Foundation must have concurrence of the majority of the Foundation Board of Directors.

BYLAWS of DAKOTA SOUTHERN BAPTIST FELLOWSHIP FOUNDATION

ARTICLE I. TERRITORY

- Section 1. The territory to be served by the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Foundation is North Dakota, South Dakota and other areas.
- Section 2. The principle office of the Foundation shall be in the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship office in Bismarck, North Dakota.

ARTICLE II. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- Section 1. The Executive Director of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship shall be the Executive Director of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Foundation.
- Section 2. The Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Nominating Committee shall recommend ministers and laity to the Fellowship to serve as directors of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Foundation.
- Section 3. There shall be at least six (6) members elected by the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship to serve as directors of the Foundation in annual meeting of the Fellowship. These shall be elected in accordance with the Constitution and Bylaws governing the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship.
- Section 4. Elected members of the Foundation shall be maintained on a rotation basis with one-third (1/3) serving a one (1) year term, one-third (1/3) serving a two (2) year term, and one-third (1/3) serving a three (3) year term.
- Section 5. The term of office for members of the Foundation shall be three (3) years. No member shall serve more than six (6) years until one (1) year has lapsed.
- Section 6. Should vacancies occur for any and all reasons, on the Foundation Board, the Fellowship Nominating Committee shall bring recommendations to the Executive Board of the Fellowship to fill such vacancies until the next regular session of the Fellowship.
- Section 7. The Board of Directors of the Foundation, at a special meeting called specifically for such purpose may, by majority vote recommend to the Executive Board of Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship the removal from office any one (1) or more of the directors.
- Section 8. The Foundation shall organize itself by the election of a president, a vice-president, a secretary, and a treasurer immediately following the annual meeting. The said officers shall serve for one (1) year and subject to reelection by the Board each year, serve for not more than three (3) years in any office. Removal of any officer during the normal business year shall be by majority vote of the Board of Directors at any regular or special meeting of the Board. Any two (2) offices may be held by the same person except that one (1) person may not simultaneously hold the offices of president and secretary.
- Section 9. The Foundation shall organize committees as is necessary for the fulfillment of its responsibilities and determine the authority of each committee.

Foundation ByLaws Page Two

Section 10. Each member of the Foundation shall be a member of a Southern Baptist church which is in cooperation with the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship.

- Section 11. A quorum at all meetings of the Board of Directors of the Foundation shall consist of a simple majority of the membership of the Board. A smaller number may, however, adjourn a meeting without further notice, until a quorum be secured. The act of a majority of the directors present at any meeting at which there is a quorum, shall be the act of the Board of Directors, except as otherwise provided by Statute or the Certificate of Incorporation.
- Section 12. Regular meetings of the Board shall be held bi-annually at a time and place agreed on by the directors.
- Section 13. Special meetings of the Board may be called at any time by the Executive Director of the Foundation, the President of the Board, or any three (3) Board members. Special meetings of the Board shall require a five-day (5) notice, given by phone, telegram, in person, in writing, or otherwise.
- Section 14. The Board of Directors may, by resolutions adopted by the majority of members of the Board, designate two (2) or more directors to constitute an Executive Committee, which to the extent provided by resolutions, shall have authority to act with the authority of the Board of Directors in certain matters of management of the Foundation.
- Section 15. Directors may receive reimbursements, deemed reasonable by the Board of Directors, for travel, food and lodging expenses incurred while attending regular meetings and/or special meetings of the Board of Directors in conducting the business of the Foundation.

ARTICLE III. OFFICERS

- Section 1. The elective officers of the Foundation shall be a president, one (1) vice-president, a secretary, and a treasurer as described in Article II Section 8.
- Section 2. The Executive Director of the Board shall be the chief executive officer of the Foundation and officers and agents shall respectively exercise and perform such powers, duties, and functions as are generally exercised by like officers in corporate affairs, and as may be directed by the Board of Directors.
- **Section 3.** The authority under which conveyances or encumbrances of all or any part of the corporate property may be made shall be by resolution of the Board of Directors. The persons who shall be authorized to execute the instruments of conveyance or encumbrance shall be the Executive Director, the President, the Vice-president or the Secretary.

ARTICLE IV. FINANCE

Section 1. The monies of the Foundation shall be deposited in the name of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Foundation in such bank or banks or trust company of trust companies or saving institutions as the Board of Directors shall designate in keeping with the desires of the donors of said monies, and may be drawn out only on checks signed in the name of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Foundation by such person or persons that the Board

of Directors, by appropriate resolution may direct. Notes and commercial paper, when authorized by the Board, shall be signed in the name of the Foundation by such officer or agent or agents as authorized by the Board.

- Section 2. The Board of Directors determine the rate of interest to be paid on restricted capital (corpus) by averaging the interest received from the many various investment accounts.
- Section 3. The Board of Directors shall manage the proceeds from the investments of unrestricted capital (corpus) to meet the purposes for which the Foundation was established.

Section 4. The Board of Directors shall have authority to make loans to churches for construction of, repair of, and additions to, new or existing buildings such loans shall not exceed ten percent (10%) of the unrestricted capital (corpus). The rate of interest charged for such loans shall be determined by the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall make a report of activities to the annual meeting of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship.

ARTICLE V. WAIVER OF NOTICE, ACTION WITHOUT MEETING

Section 1. Any member or director may waive, in writing, any notice required to be given him/her under these bylaws, whether before, at, or after the time stated therein.

Section 2. Any action which may be taken at a meeting of the directors may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed by all of the directors entitled to vote with respect to the subject matter thereof.

ARTICLE VI. VOTING

Section 1. At each meeting of the Board of Directors of this Foundation, each Board member shall be entitled to one (1) vote.

Section 2. There shall be no proxy voting.


ARTICLE VII. SEAL


The Board of Directors shall provide a corporate seal, which shall be circular in form and shall be inscribed thereon the name of the Foundation and the words "Corporate Seal."

ARTICLE VIII. AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws may be changed at any Annual Meeting of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship. The Foundation Board of Directors may make any suggestion of change to the Constitution Committee of the Executive Board of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship.

Recommendation concerning changes shall come to the Fellowship through the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Executive Board.

35% of the offering will be used to promote and develop new work within the Dakota Fellowship. We now have 91 churches and missions.

The other 15% of the offering will be used for:

CAMPS:

The offering will help in summer camps for children, youth and Fellowship Acteens IMPACT.

INTERNATIONALS:

The offering will help Baptist Student Directors minister to students from other countries. While attending our colleges and universities, many accept Christ. When they go back home, they witness to their families and friends.

STUDENT WORK:

The offering will help local Baptist Student Union directors as they minister to students. It will also help Dakota Fellowship BSU summer missionaries as they serve in our own Fellowship and other home mission areas.

MISSION VBS:

The offering will help Mission Vacation Bible Schools. This might include materials, rentals for meeting places, refreshments and other expenses.

EVANGELISM TENTS:

The offering will assist in the upkeep of the tents used for crusade evangelism.


VIM MINISTRY:



DAKOTA SOUTHERN BAPTIST FELLOWSHIP

"Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship providing leadership and assistance in fulfilling the Mission of Christ."

The Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship (DSBF) is experiencing another year of blessings. Early reports from the associations indicate that baptisms increased more than ten percent (10%) over last year. DSBF churches continue to increase membership while the total population of North and South Dakota remains level.

- * There are currently 79 churches and 18 missions in the Dakotas.
- * Eighty-one (81) pastors currently serve 91 of these congregations. There are six (6) pastorless churches in the Dakotas.
- * The percentage of Cooperative Program (CP) gifts forwarded to the National CP advanced another one-half percent (½%) to fifteen and one-half percent (15.5%).
- * The CP finished 1994 at the highest level ever.
- * The CP for 1995 is about even with this time last year.
- * Five (5) new mission congregations have started meeting this year.
- * The churches in the western side of North Dakota formed the Badlands Baptist Association.
 This is the seventh association in the Dakotas.
- * The Church Strategist/DOAMs indicated twenty-eight (28) new places to start congregations.
- * The churches of the Siouxland Baptist Association had a baptismal ratio of one (1) person baptized for every 8.4 members in 1993-94. This year, 1994-95, they dropped the ratio to one (1) person for ever 6.9 members.

CAMPUS MINISTRIES

God continues to expand the ministry to the campuses in the Dakotas. Basically all the local campus ministries are led by volunteers, and they're doing a great job. In our six (6) campus ministries, one hundred ninety-one (191) students were reached; ninety-eight (98) students were active in ministry Bible studies and programs; and three (3) students accepted Christ.

Three (3) college students from the Dakotas served as in-state summer missionaries.

Two (2) directors and four (4) students attended Mission 95 in Louisville, Kentucky. Mission 95 is a missions event that occurs every five (5) years which is organized by the Sunday School Board and supported by the other SBC boards and agencies. Two (2) of those students are seeking the Lord's will concerning missions as a vocation.

In February our second annual Dakota Student Work Weekend brought a total of seventeen (17) students and leaders to Prairie Community Baptist Church in Woonsocket, SD. During the day the students painted the interior of the church; in the evening music was led by Tim Melton and Bible studies were led by Tim Redding. On Sunday morning students led the worship services at both Woonsocket and Calvary Baptist Church, Mitchell, SD.

Most of the campus ministries continue to be tied fairly closely with the local churches. Campus ministries in the Dakotas are as follows:

EVANGELISM

When we gathered at Calvary Baptist Church in Rapid City, SD, no one expected that the attendance would surpass 200 during the day sessions and nearly 400 on Wednesday evening. The Stone Brothers sang and played their trumpets, stirring the hearts of all present. Cecil Seagle from Florida; J.W. Hutchens from the Home Mission Board; and others delivered excellent sermons.

The Youth of the Dakotas brought two other surprises. Two hundred and twenty-one (221) youth and sponsors registered for the April Youth meeting. Eleven (11) churches that had not attended in the past were represented. Six (6) professions of faith were recorded.

The second surprise came the first week of August at the Youth Summer Celebration. Two hundred thirty-three (233) youth and sponsors attended the camp. The girls' dorms were packed to capacity. Eight (8) youth made professions of faith and numerous other decisions were made. Steve Evans and the drama group from Calvary Baptist Church, Rapid City, SD, led the services. The only sad note of our youth work is that Tim Melton, US-2 evangelism worker, who was the preacher for the camp, ended his three years in assisting the Evangelism Department with state youth events. Tim will attend Southwestern Baptist Seminary in Fort Worth, TX, to continue his preparation for ministry.

The Florida Youth Revival Team divided their time between the Dakotas and Montana. They were in eight (8) Dakota churches and reported eighteen (18) professions of faith from these meetings.

Dub Bryant, Evangelism Director, who has served Dakota/Montana since 1982, concluded his work with the Dakotas in September. He has moved to Montana and will work full-time as a Home Mission Board Evangelism Consultant.

FAMILY MINISTRY/LIFE SUPPORT

The Family Ministry/Life Support Department of The Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship is responsible for providing leadership through planning, promotion, training and administration for Family Enrichment and Life Support Programs of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship and the Baptist Sunday School Board.

Four (4) training events were held throughout North and South Dakota for Conquering Chemical Dependency and Conquering Co-dependency. The events were led by Al Peratt, Sioux Falls, SD, and Troy Barber, Bismarck, ND. A total of forty (40) persons received the training.

A city-wide Singles Weekend was held in Bismarck reaching thirty-five (35) Singles from churches of the city. Mary is available to assist any church in the Dakotas in establishing a Singles group.

The Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship and the Baptist Sunday School Board provided training for Cindy and Carl Steele at Glorieta this summer in the area of ministering to the traditional family and for Mary Burch in ministering to Singles. These individuals will be offering training in the Dakotas during 1996.

We realize none of our churches can afford to hire a full time Family Minister or possibly have a full Family Ministry Council. We must, however, be conscious to minister to families at all times.

I would like to encourage each church to continue placing emphasis on the family as we seek to reach the Dakotas for Christ.

"A Time to Grow" has been an exciting theme during the past year in WMU, with several new organizations started throughout the Dakotas.





Pat and I had the opportunity in November to be guest World Mission Conference speakers in the north Tampa area of Florida. Even though that association is linked with an association in Montana, our goal was to strengthen our Florida relationship and we feel we accomplished that.

I had the privilege to lead three Great Challenge Stewardship Campaigns at Riverwood in Bismarck, Cornerstone in Grand Forks and Hallock. The churches have reported very positive results and I would encourage churches to challenge their people at least once a year with the command to give scripturally.





Annual Report

The purpose of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Foundation is to channel money to mission projects in the Dakotas. The Dakota Fellowship Executive Board has asked the Foundation to be self sustaining and, therefore, it does not use Cooperative Program money.

The dream and goal of the Board of Directors is to see assistance given to help with mission needs like: 1) to purchase sites for new mission congregations; 2) to assist small churches during financial crisis; 3) for housing grants for churches and pastors to build parsonages; and 4) for grants for new building projects.

During the 1994-95 year, there has been growth in the corpus administered by the Board. Operating Funds were \$55,000.00*. The Interest earned was \$6,604.97. The percentage used for administration and expenses is .5%.

During the year, the following activities were taken by the Board: 1) set the interest given for 1994 funds at 6.22%; 2) administering \$39,500.00 in three building loans; and 3) made plans to develop brochures to help people know how to invest in future mission projects in the Dakotas.

The future of the DSBF Foundation is exciting as we work together to invest in the future mission projects in the Dakotas.

* Restricted funds are handled by the Board as well as general funds. The total Foundation funds balance as of 5-5-95 was \$135,349.92.

Greetings in the dear name of our Lord Jesus Christ. I praise Him for the tremendous outpouring of His blessings upon Southern Baptists as evidenced by two consecutive years of record giving through the Cooperative Program, 1993-94 and 1994-95.

The Executive Committee of the Southern Baptist Convention received and distributed \$145,739,490 surpassing last year by \$2.9 million and our Cooperative Program Allocation Budget for 1994-95 by \$9.2 million. The funds received over the Cooperative Program Allocation Budget have been distributed 37 percent to the Foreign Mission Board, 31.5 percent to Program Advance, and 31.5 percent to Capital Needs. The Program Advance funds were distributed on the percentage basis of the Cooperative Program Allocation Budget. I am enclosing, for your information, a chart showing the complete distribution of funds to each entity of the Convention.

These are exciting times in our denomination, and I praise God for each of you. Thank you for your commitment to the Cooperative Program and for your part in helping Southern Baptists envision the great need to reach the world for Christ. I look forward expectantly to all that God has in store for us as we work together, with our Lord's help, to share the Good News around the world.


