CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I: NAME

This Fellowship shall be called the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship.

ARTICLE II: MEMBERSHIP

This Fellowship in session shall be composed of three (3) messengers per cooperating church with resident membership of fifty (50) or less and one (1) additional messenger for each additional fifty (50) resident members or majority fraction thereof or one (1) additional messenger for each \$500 contributed through the Cooperative Program, except that no church may have more than ten (10) messengers.

ARTICLE III: PURPOSE

Section 1. This Fellowship is a nonprofit corporation through which Southern Baptist may work harmoniously in cooperation in promoting all enterprises they deem necessary in carrying out the Great Commission.

Section 2. This Fellowship, in keeping with its stated purpose, shall not attempt to exercise control over the cooperating churches.

Section 3. This Corporation is organized, and will always operate, exclusively for religious purposes, and no part of the net earnings of this Corporation inure, or will ever inure, to the benefit of any individual or of any private shareholder, there being no shareholders. None of the income of this organization may inure to the benefits of any private individual or members and the assets of the Corporation are irrevocably dedicated to and for religious purposes, and upon dissolution of the Corporation, the Executive Board of the Corporation will cause the assets of the Corporation to be distributed, after the payment of creditors, to an organization which will use said assets exclusively for religious purposes.

ARTICLE IV: OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of the Fellowship shall be a president, vice president, recording secretary, assistant recording secretary, and such other officers as the Fellowship may deem necessary.

Section 2. These officers shall be elected annually by a majority vote of the members present and voting at the annual meeting of the Fellowship. They shall take office at the close of the annual meeting, and hold office until their successors are elected and installed.

Section 3. The duties of these officers shall be those usually required in similar organizations.

ARTICLE V: EXECUTIVE BOARD

The Fellowship shall elect an Executive Board as set forth in the Bylaws.

ARTICLE VI: COMMITTEES

The committees of the Fellowship shall be a Nominating Committee, Program Committee, a Committee on Committees, and such other committees as are needed to carry out its work.

ARTICLE VII: MEETINGS

Section 1. The Fellowship shall meet at such time and place as may be designated by the Fellowship at its annual meting.

Section 2. In an emergency the president of the Fellowship, acting in cooperation with the Executive Board, may change the time and /or place of the regular annual meeting.

Section 3. In an emergency the president of the Fellowship, acting in cooperation with the Executive Board, may call a special meeting of the Fellowship.

ARTICLE VIII: CONTRIBUTIONS AND FUNDS

Section 1. The Cooperative Program shall be the chief means through which the Fellowship shall support its missionary endeavors.

Section 2. All funds of this Fellowship shall be raised by voluntary contributions, provided this does not prevent acquiring of property by bequest or use of any income property that may be bequeathed to or purchased by the Fellowship.

Section 3. All designated gifts accepted by this Fellowship shall be used strictly according to the expressed will and direction of the donor.

ARTICLE IX: AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amended in the following manner:

- (1) Presenting copies of the proposed amendment(s) to the messengers while the Fellowship is in session.
- (2) Proposed amendment(s) shall lies over until the next regular meeting of the Fellowship.
- (3) Proposed amendment(s) shall require two-thirds (2/3) majority of the messengers voting.

PROPOSED
ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
AND
CONSTITUTION
DAKOTA SOUTHERN BAPTIST FELLOWSHIP

ARTICLE I – NAME

The name of this corporation is and shall be the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship, Inc.

ARTICLE II – DURATION

The term of this corporation shall be perpetual, unless sooner dissolved.

ARTICLE III – PURPOSE

The purpose of this non-profit corporation, hereafter known as the Fellowship, shall be to furnish a medium of cooperation for the cooperating Baptist churches of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship in their divinely commissioned work of missions, evangelism, education, and benevolence. This Fellowship is an autonomous body made up of messengers in annual session from cooperating Baptist churches to fulfill the purpose for which the churches organized the Fellowship. This Fellowship shall not exercise authority over any church, but shall always recognize and uphold the church's autonomy under Christ.

The purposes and powers of the corporation is not intended to prohibit or limit the exercise of any other or further right or power which the corporation might now or hereafter be permitted by law, provided always that such powers shall be exercised for the use and benefit of the membership of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship and shall be exercised in a fashion consistent with its purpose and fulfilling the Great Commission.

This Fellowship/corporation is organized, and will always operate, exclusively for religious purposes, and no part of the net earnings of this corporation will ever inure to the benefit or any individual or of any private shareholder, there being no shareholders. None of the income of this organization may inure to the benefit of any private individual or member and the assets of the corporation are irrevocably dedicated to and for religious purposes.

ARTICLE IV – MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1. The members of this Fellowship shall consist of messengers to the Fellowship in annual or called session, elected by the Baptist churches cooperating with and contributing to the Fellowship through the Cooperative Program, and sympathetic with its purposes and work.

SECTION 2. This Fellowship in session shall be composed of three (3) messengers per cooperating church with resident membership of fifty (50) or less and one (1) additional messenger for each additional fifty (50) resident members or one (1) additional messenger for each \$500 contributed through the Cooperative Program, except that no church may have more than ten (10) messengers. Each church-type mission shall be entitled to one (1) messenger from that mission to the Fellowship in session and such messenger does not count toward the limit of ten (10) messengers from the Sponsoring Church.

SECTION 3. The basis for determining the resident membership or contributions shall be the previous year's annual report to the Fellowship.

ARTICLE V – NONPROFIT CORPORATION

This being a nonprofit corporation organized under Chapter 10-24 of the North Dakota Century Code, as amended, such corporation shall not have capital stock, and no dividends or pecuniary benefits shall be declared or paid to any member thereof. The corporation shall neither have nor exercise any power, nor engage directly or indirectly in any activity that would invalidate its status as an organization exempt from federal income tax and described in Section 501[c](3) of the Internal Revenue code of 1986, as amended, or the corresponding provision or provisions of any subsequent United States Internal Revenue law or laws (the "Internal Revenue code of 1986"), or that would invalidate its status as a non-profit corporation under North Dakota law.

ARTICLE VI – CORPORATE OFFICE AND AGENT

The address of its registered office is 2020 Lovett Avenue, Bismarck, ND 58504, and the name of its registered agent at such address is the Executive Director-Treasurer of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship, W. D. Lindsey or his successor.

ARTICLE VII – OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The officers of the Fellowship shall be a president, vice president, recording secretary, assistant recording secretary, and such other officers as the Fellowship may deem necessary.

SECTION 2. These officers shall be elected annually by a majority vote of the members present and voting at the annual meeting of the Fellowship. They shall take office at the close of the annual meeting, and hold office until their successors are elected and installed.

SECTION 3. Other employees of the Fellowship, its Boards or Agencies shall not be eligible for election to offices. The Executive Director-Treasurer shall serve as the chief executive officer and treasurer of the Fellowship, and serve as an ex-officio with member vote of all Fellowship and Executive Board committees.

ARTICLE VIII – EXECUTIVE BOARD

The Fellowship shall elect an Executive Board as set forth in the bylaws, and it shall serve as the Fellowship ad interim and as principal advisory to the Fellowship on its total program.

ARTICLE IX – AGENCIES

SECTION 1. The agency of the Fellowship is the Baptist Foundation. The Fellowship may establish other agencies. All agency board members shall be members of cooperating churches.

SECTION 2. The Fellowship in annual session shall approve or amend the articles of incorporation of the agency by two-thirds vote, providing no amendment may be considered after the second session of the annual meeting, and that the proposed amendment be submitted in writing to the Fellowship office at least one-hundred twenty (120) days prior to the annual meeting. Notice of amendments must be published in the state Baptist paper or mailed to the churches at least ninety (90) days prior to the annual meeting.

SECTION 3. The agency board of directors shall be elected by the Fellowship for a three-year term; one-third elected each year, and shall be nominated by the Nominating Committee. The number of directors, their qualifications and responsibilities, shall be contained in the Agency's articles of incorporation and by-laws. The Nominating Committee's recommendations shall be forwarded to the Fellowship office one-hundred-twenty days (120) prior to the annual meeting.

SECTION 4. If a vacancy occurs, the Executive Board may elect a qualified person to serve until the next regular annual meeting, such person being recommended by the Nominating Committee. In no case may a vacancy continue for longer than six (6) months or until the next annual meeting, whichever occurs first. The Fellowship shall at its next regular annual session fill the vacancy for the unexpired term.

SECTION 5. Agency board of directors may be replaced by the Fellowship in session for misfeasance, incapacity, failure to perform their proper duties, conduct which would bring discredit upon the corporation, or transferring membership from a church or mission cooperating with the Fellowship.

SECTION 6. The Fellowship shall exercise oversight of all agencies; however, the management of the affairs of each agency shall be by its elected board of directors

(trustees). The board of directors shall hold title to properties, real and personal; to act as a fiduciary, fiscal and agent of the agency; to employ agency personnel; to make contracts in behalf of the agency; and to conduct long range planning to reach the objectives of the agency.

SECTION 7. Each agency shall report to the Fellowship in the Annual Meeting; this report shall include financial audit reports, projected budgets, progress on program objectives in light of long-range plans, and the Fellowship or its Executive Director may request other necessary information as.

ARTICLE X – COMMITTEES

The committees of the Fellowship shall be a Constitution Committee, Credentials Committee, Resolution Committee, Nominating Committee, Committee on Committees, Program Committee, and such other committees as are needed to carry out its work. Trustees to Boards and members of committees shall be elected by the Fellowship, and the plan of organization shall be established in the Articles of Incorporation and Constitution, and the By-laws of the Fellowship.

ARTICLE XI– MEETINGS

SECTION 1. The Fellowship shall meet at such time and place as may be designated by the Fellowship at its annual meeting.

SECTION 2. In an emergency the president of the Fellowship, acting in cooperation with the Executive Board, may change the time and/or place of the regular annual meeting.

SECTION 3. In an emergency the president of the Fellowship, acting in cooperation with the Executive Board, may call a special meeting of the Fellowship.

ARTICLE XII – CONTRIBUTIONS AND FUNDS

SECTION 1. The Cooperative Program shall be the chief means through which the Fellowship shall support its missionary endeavors.

SECTION 2. All funds of this Fellowship shall be raised by voluntary contributions, provided this does not prevent acquiring of property by bequest or use of any bequest or use of any income property that may be bequeathed by the Fellowship.

SECTION 3. All designated gifts accepted by this Fellowship shall be used strictly according to the expressed will and direction of the donor.

ARTICLE XIII - INDEMNIFICATION

The Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship, and its respective agencies for their work, shall indemnify any trustee or officer or former director or officer of the corporation, and their respective heirs, administrators, successors, and assigns, against any and all expenses, including amounts paid upon judgments, counsel fees, and amounts paid in settlement (before or after suit is commenced), actually and reasonably incurred by such persons in connection with the defense or settlement of any claim, action, suit or proceeding in which they, or any of them, are made parties, or a party, or which may be asserted against them or any of them, by reason of having been trustees or officers or a trustee or officer of the corporation; provided, however, that such indemnity should not be operative with respect to (a) any matter as to which such person shall have been adjudged in such action, suit, or proceeding to be liable for negligence or misconduct in the performance of his duties as such trustee, officer, or employee, or (b) any matter settled or compromised, unless, in the opinion of independent counsel selected by or in a manner determined by the trustees, there is not reasonable ground for such person's being adjudged liable for negligence or misconduct in the performance of his duties as such trustees or officer.

ARTICLE XIV - AMENDMENT

Amendments may be made in this Constitution/Articles by a vote of two-thirds of the members present when the vote is taken without regard to total enrollment at any annual meeting of the Fellowship, provided (1) no amendment may be considered after the second session of the Fellowship and (2) that the proposed change be submitted in writing to the Fellowship office and the Executive Board at least 120 days prior to the annual session and published in the state Baptist paper or mailed to the churches ninety (90) days prior to the annual session.

ARTICLE XV - DISSOLUTION

In the event of the dissolution of the corporation, all of its property, whether real, personal or mixed, of whatsoever nature and wheresoever situated shall vest in the cooperating churches or their legal successors. The corporation shall have authority to liquidate in such manner as they deem advisable and advantageous and turn over to the North American Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention for work in the areas of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship the proceeds derived from such liquidation.

Assets held by the corporation that are subject to condition requiring return, transfer or conveyance, which condition occurs by reason of the dissolution, shall be returned, transferred or conveyed in accordance with such requirements.

Under no condition or circumstances shall any member or members, director or directors, officer or officers, or any other persons connected with this corporation share in the proceeds of such liquidation.

ARTICLE XVI – PROPERTY

The authority under which conveyances or encumbrances of all or any part of the corporate property may be made shall be authorized as established in the Articles of Incorporation and Constitution, and Bylaws of the Fellowship.

ARTICLE XVII -INDEBTEDNESS

All borrowing by this Fellowship for its own use, or for any agencies and institutions, or borrowing by any institution or agency, which directly or indirectly obligates this Fellowship, the payment of which would require an extension of time beyond the close of the subsequent fiscal year, shall be authorized only on the following terms and conditions:

SECTION 1. The Executive Board shall have authority to borrow funds in anticipation of current revenue, provided that any unpaid balance of such borrowing at the end of the current fiscal year shall be provided in and made a part of the budget for the subsequent year.

SECTION 2. Neither this Fellowship, nor any institution or agency, owned or supported in whole or in part by this Fellowship, shall accept or receive, directly or indirectly, any gift, grant, or aid from the Federal or state governments or any government agency, except for definite services rendered by the agency or institution. Such must have the approval of agency's board and reported in full to the Fellowship's Executive Board.

SECTION 3. No institution or agency of this Fellowship shall encumber its real property or change its status with respect to this Fellowship without authority from this Fellowship.

SECTION 4. Institutions and agencies of this Fellowship shall have authority to borrow money in anticipation of current revenue, provided that any unpaid balance of such borrowing at the end of the current fiscal year shall be provided for in and made a part of the budget for the subsequent current year.

SECTION 5. Any anticipated borrowing of funds in excess of the provisions of the above sections must have the specific approval of the Fellowship in session.

ARTICLE XVIII – AUTHORITY-SUPERSEDE

These Articles of Incorporation and Constitution correctly set forth the provisions of the Articles of Incorporation of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship as amended, and they have been adopted as required by law and they supersede the original Articles of Incorporation and all amendments.

II: OFFICERS

Officers shall be elected annually. Officers shall be nominated from the floor and elected by ballot. The president and vice president shall be eligible to serve two(2) years in succession. Other officers may serve indefinitely.

III: EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 1. The Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Nominating Committee shall recommend persons to the Fellowship for election to the Executive Board.

Each association with four (4) churches and two hundred (200) resident members may have one (1) Board member, and one (1) additional Board member when they reach four hundred (400), eight hundred (800), and twelve hundred (1200) resident members. No association may have more than four (4) Board members. One (1) representative from a language congregation shall serve a three (3) year term on the executive Board.

** Change: One (1) Board member from a language congregation.*

Section 4. Employees of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship shall not be eligible to serve on the Executive Board except as advisors or non voting ex officio members. The Executive Director of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship shall serve as an advisory member and consultant to the Executive Board and all Fellowship committees.

** Change: eliminate underlined section*

Section 5. Board members eligible to serve are those who have been in the Fellowship area a minimum six (6) months and whose churches contribute at least quarterly through the Cooperative Program

Section 6. The term of office shall be three (3) years. Members elected to unexpired terms may

serve out the term and be eligible for one (1) full term. No member shall be eligible to serve more than six (6) years until a minimum of one (1) year has elapsed. A member moving from the association from which he/she has been chosen automatically goes off the Board.

Section 7. The Executive Board has authority to act for the Fellowship between regular meetings of the Fellowship except that it cannot impose its will on the Fellowship by rescinding or contradicting any action taken in a regular Fellowship meeting.

Section 8. Members of the Executive Board shall be elected by the Fellowship in session upon recommendation of the Fellowship nominating committee. The nominating committee may receive suggestions from the associations. The nominating committee shall appoint to the Executive Board to fill vacancies on the Board until such unexpired terms are filled by action of the Fellowship at the next regular meeting of the Fellowship.

Section 9. The president, vice president, recording secretary, and assistant recording secretary of the Fellowship shall be members of the Executive Board.

** Change: ex officio non voting members of the Executive Board.*

Section 10. The Executive Board shall meet at least twice a year on a date suggested by the Fellowship Director and approved by the Executive Board. Fifty percent (50%) of the () Board members shall constitute a quorum at the meeting.

Change: add, voting members

Section 11. The Executive Board shall organize itself as described within the Executive Board Manual.

Section 12. The Executive Board shall act as the authorized legal agent for the Fellowship.

IV: AGENCIES

Section 1. The Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Nominating Committee shall recommend ministers and laity to the Fellowship to serve as directors or trustees of all agencies.

Section 2. There shall be at least six (6) members elected to serve as directors or trustees of all agencies.

Section 3. Elected members of all agencies shall be maintained on a rotation basis with one-third (1/3) serving a one (1) year term, one-third (1/3) serving a two year term, and one-third (1/3) serving a three (3) year term.

Section 4. The term of office for members of all agencies shall be three (3) years. No member shall serve more than six (6) years until one (1) year has elapsed.

Section 5. Should vacancies occur on any agency, the Fellowship nominating committee shall, in consultation with the directors of trustees and committees of agency, bring recommendations to the Executive Board to fill such vacancies until the next regular session of the Fellowship.

**Change: eliminate directors of*

Section 6. Every agency shall organize itself by the election of appropriate officers immediately following the annual meeting.

Section 7. Every agency shall organize committees and is necessary for the fulfillment of its responsibilities and determine the authority of each committee.

Section 8. Each member of every agency shall be a member of a Southern Baptist church which is in cooperation with the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship.

**Change: and shall have been in the Fellowship area a minimum of six (6) months and whose church contributes at least quarterly through the Cooperative Program.*

V: FELLOWSHIP EMPLOYEES

Section 1. The Executive Board shall employ all Fellowship personnel, except office secretaries.

Section 2. The Executive Director shall employ all office secretaries in counsel with department directors.

Section 3. The Executive Director shall give general supervision and /or counsel to the work of the Fellowship through its departments and agencies. He shall receive and retain in the Fellowship office all historical data.

Section 4. The executive Director and all department directors shall present a written report of their stewardship the the Fellowship at the annual meeting.

Section 5. The Executive Board shall contract with all employed personnel on an indefinite time basis and a thirty-day (30) notice shall be given by either party of the desire to end the contract, except by mutual agreement.

Section 6. The Executive Director shall serve as ex-officio, without voting, on all committees, and aid by furnishing information, printed materials and needed guidance for the work of committees.

Section 7. There shall be a Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship policy manual ()setting forth all policies, procedures and practices for all Fellowship employees.

Change: maintained by the Personnel Committee

VI: COMMITTEES

Section 1. The Committee on Committees shall consist of at least five (5) members appointed by the president of the Fellowship in consultation with the vice president of the Fellowship. This committee shall appoint the Resolutions Committee, the Time-Place-Preacher Committee, the Nominating Committee (). All special committees authorized by the Fellowship shall be appointed by the President of the Committee on Committee.

line 5 *Chairman*

Section 2. The Nominating Committee, consisting of one representative from each association, () shall be responsible for nominating persons to the Executive Board and all Fellowship agencies.

* Change: *represented on the Executive Board.*

Section 3. The Program Committee of the Fellowship shall consist of the president, vice president, the Executive Director of the Fellowship, host pastor, the WMU president, the Brotherhood president, and the president of the Pastor's Conference.

Section 4. The president, vice president, and Fellowship Director shall serve as ex-officio members of all Fellowship committees of which they are not already a part.

Section 5. Ex-officio committee members shall serve in an advisory capacity only.

VII: AMENDMENTS

The Bylaws may be amended in the following manner:

- (1) At any regular meeting of the Fellowship except the last session.
- (2) An amendment must be presented in writing and copies made available to the messengers at either the first or second session.
- (3) Voted on at a stated time during subsequent sessions.
- (4) Received two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of those voting.

VIII: RULES OF ORDER

The New Testament and Robert's Rule of Order Revised shall govern the conduct of the proceedings of the Fellowship, not otherwise provided for in the constitution and bylaws.

PROPOSED
BYLAWS
DAKOTA SOUTHERN BAPTIST FELLOWSHIP

ARTICLE I – MESSENGERS

SECTION 1. Each church shall present to the Credentials Committee of the Fellowship a list of its elected messengers, according to the Articles of Incorporation and Constitution, Article IV.

SECTION 2. Each messenger shall register with the Credentials Committee prior to being seated as a messenger to the Fellowship.

SECTION 3. The Credentials Committee shall review the credentials of the registered messengers and make its report to the Fellowship in the first session of business of the Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE II – MEETINGS

SECTION 1. The regular meeting of the Fellowship shall be known as the Annual Meeting, and shall be for the purpose of electing officers, receiving reports of officers, committees, and boards, and for any other business that may arise.

SECTION 2. Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised (Latest Edition) shall be recognized as the standard authority to guide the Fellowship on questions of parliamentary law and custom.

SECTION 3. The Fellowship shall determine its order of business at the first session of the Annual Meeting.

SECTION 4. Special sessions of the Fellowship may be scheduled. The president working with the Executive Board may call the Fellowship into special session if it deems it necessary. The Fellowship in session can call for a special session by a majority vote.

SECTION 5. The minutes of the Annual Meeting shall be received by the Executive Board at its formation meeting following the Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE III – OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The officers of the Fellowship shall be president, vice president, recording secretary and assistant recording secretary. The office of treasurer shall be filled by the Executive Director-Treasurer of the Fellowship for an indefinite term.

SECTION 2. Officers shall be chosen annually from messengers in attendance at the Annual Meeting. Officers shall be members of cooperating Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship churches. Nominations shall be from the floor. Election shall be by ballot except when there is a single nominee for an office. In the latter case the president shall instruct the secretary to cast a unanimous ballot for the nominee.

SECTION 3. Employees of the Fellowship, its boards and agencies are not eligible to serve as elected officers of the Fellowship, with the exception of the Executive Director-Treasurer who serves an indefinite term.

SECTION 4. Officers shall serve for one (1) year and hold office until their successors are elected and qualified; however, no officer may serve more than two (2) complete successive terms in the same office except the recording secretary and assistant recording secretary. Terms of office shall commence at final adjournment of the Fellowship in session at the time of their election and terminate at final adjournment of the succeeding regular session of the Fellowship. In case of death, disability of, or other cause making necessary the retirement of the president, the vice president and recording secretary shall succeed in order. The Executive Board shall determine when an office is vacant due to the disability of an incumbent.

SECTION 5. The president shall preside over the deliberations of the Fellowship and shall perform such duties as may be customary to the position or as determined in the Constitution/Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the Fellowship and shall, by election, become an ex officio member of all Fellowship committees and boards. The president is empowered to appoint the vice president to serve as ex officio member with vote of any committee or board in his/her absence.

SECTION 6. The vice president may, in the absence of the president or when requested by the president, preside over the Fellowship meeting and shall perform such other duties as may be provided in the Constitution/Articles of Incorporation and By-laws of the Fellowship or as requested by the president.

SECTION 7. The recording secretary shall produce accurate and faithful and timely minutes of all sessions of the Fellowship. The minutes shall be published in suitable form in the Annual of the Fellowship together with such other information as the Fellowship or the Executive Board deems necessary and proper. The assistant recording secretary will assist in these duties. The office of the Executive Director-Treasurer may provide assistance as needed.

SECTION 8. The presiding officer may appoint a parliamentarian to assist if the presiding officer deems it necessary.

ARTICLE IV – EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR-TREASURER

SECTION 1. The Fellowship shall employ an Executive Director-Treasurer as its chief executive officer and treasurer. He shall provide spiritual leadership for the total program of the Fellowship.

SECTION 2. When a vacancy of the Executive Director-Treasurer position occurs, the Administrative/Personnel Committee of the Executive Board of the Fellowship shall recommend a candidate for the position of Executive Director-Treasurer to the Executive Board. The Administrative/Personnel Committee of the Board will serve as the Search Committee, and will bring a recommendation to the Executive Board. A two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Executive Board is necessary to elect a candidate. With permission of the candidate, the Executive Board shall release biographical data to the churches of the Fellowship. When a vacancy occurs the Executive Board may select an interim Executive Director-Treasurer to serve until the Executive Board acts to elect a successor.

SECTION 3. A position description in the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Salary Administration Plan shall describe the tasks and responsibilities of the Executive Director-Treasurer.

SECTION 4. The Fellowship in session may terminate the Executive Director-Treasurer by majority vote. Or the Executive Board may terminate the Executive Director-Treasurer by two-thirds vote of the elected members.

ARTICLE V – COOPERATING CHURCH OR CHURCH TYPE MISSION

A cooperating church or church type mission shall be one that contributes at least quarterly to the work of the Fellowship through the Cooperative Program and reports to the Fellowship each year on the approved and provided forms.

ARTICLE VI – FELLOWSHIP COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. STANDING COMMITTEES

The Committee on Committees shall nominate the Standing Committees, including their chairmen, for election by the Fellowship in session. The committees will elect their own secretary. The committees will schedule meetings as needed but should utilize the times around activities of the Fellowship, such as conferences. All committees should review its work and consult with the Fellowship president and Executive Director-Treasurer.

- (a) **Constitution and Bylaws.** The principle duty of the committee is to review the Constitution and Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the Fellowship and the Bylaws of its agencies, and to recommend changes it deems necessary. The committee should present its recommendations to the president and Executive Director-Treasurer by April 1, and to the Executive Board at its spring meeting for review and suggestions, and publish the recommendations in the state Baptist paper or mail to the churches by June 15.

- (b) **Nominations Committee.** The committee is to recommend members for the Executive Board of the Fellowship and members for the board of directors of the agencies of the Fellowship according to the Constitution/Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the Fellowship. A diversity of committee nominees is desired, such as male/female, race, clergy/laity, area of residence in state, number from each church and number from each association. Each nominee will act in the best interest of the total Fellowship work. The nominee does not represent an association, church, or any other entity. He/she represents the Fellowship. A full report is to be sent to the Executive Director-Treasurer for the Book of Reports of the Fellowship by June 1.

SECTION 2. ANNUAL COMMITTEES

Annual committees and their chairmen are appointed by the president of the Fellowship within thirty (30) days following the Annual Meeting.

- (a) **Annual Session/Program Committee.** The committee is to plan the program and future sites for the Annual Meeting. The Program Committee of the Fellowship shall consist of the president, vice president, secretary, the Executive Director-Treasurer of the Fellowship, the Office Manager of the Fellowship, the host association or the host pastor, the Fellowship WMU president, and the president of the Pastor's Conference. They will also assist in enlisting program personnel, assist the president in amending the order of business during the Annual Meeting, and assist with other related matters as requested. The committee is to select an adequate site for the Annual Meeting of the Fellowship, considering the rotation of cities for the Fellowship, availability of local Baptist families to host messengers, adequate meeting space, and adequate hotel/motel rooms. The committee will name the Annual Meeting preacher and the alternate for the next Annual Meeting. The Executive Board will recommend to the committee the times and dates of the Annual Meeting two to five years in advance.
- (b) **Credentials Committee.** The committee is to certify messengers from churches of the Fellowship. They will present messengers with badges, ballots, and materials for the execution of their duties. The committee will also assist the president in all balloting, certifying votes, and elections, and assist in related matters as requested.
- (c) **Committee on Committees.** The committee is to recommend committee members according to the requirements of the Articles of Incorporation and Constitution, and Bylaws. They are to gather suggestions from the churches, including biographical data, and if possible schedule an interview by one of the members with the candidate.
- (d) **Resolutions Committee.** The committee shall review all properly submitted resolutions and shall present resolutions to the Fellowship for its consideration. All proposed resolutions to the Fellowship are to be submitted in writing. The committee may reword resolutions for clarity, combine like issues into one resolution or reject resolutions which have been previously addressed or are inappropriate.

ARTICLE VII – EXECUTIVE BOARD

Organization

SECTION 1. The Executive Board shall organize itself and elect its officers upon the adjournment of the Annual Meeting. The organization shall include an Administrative/Personnel Committee, Finance Committee, and Missions/Programs Committee. With the exception of the Administrative/Personnel Committee, each committee will have at least six members. The chairman of the Executive Board will recommend appointment of the committee members to the board for approval. The Board may establish other committees as needed. Each committee member will act in the best interest of the total Fellowship work. The committee member does not represent an association, church, or any other entity. He/she represents the Fellowship.

SECTION 2. Number of Members. The Executive Board shall be composed of nineteen (19) elected members and two (2) ex-officio members (Executive Director and President).

SECTION 3. Administrative/Personnel Committee. The Executive Board shall establish an Administrative/Personnel Committee, which shall meet as necessary between sessions of the Executive Board. The Administrative/Personnel Committee shall perform the duties assigned to it by the Executive Board. The Administrative/Personnel Committee is made up of six (6) members of the Executive Board, the Executive Board Chairman, and the Executive Director-Treasurer. The specific duties of the committee are to act between sessions of the Executive Board as assigned, monitor and recommend policies of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship, help prepare the Board agenda, recommend the Executive Board organization and temporary work groups, supervise the Executive Director-Treasurer on behalf of the Board, serve as the search committee for an Executive Director-Treasurer when a vacancy occurs, receive the Executive Director-Treasurer's recommendation of prospective staff personnel and participate with the Executive Director-Treasurer and staff in developing and implementing a long range strategy plan.

SECTION 4. Missions/Programs Committee. The committee is to oversee the functions and work of church development, new work/language missions, evangelism and ministries. The committee will work with staff in long range planning, proposing program objectives and priorities to the Board and in the evaluation of program accomplishments, and approving budget supplements for new mission congregations. The state program directors shall be ex officio members of the committee, but without vote.

SECTION 5. Finance Committee. The committee is to serve as the budget committee of the Board, review, evaluate and recommend financial policies of the Fellowship to the Executive Board, arrange for and review the annual audit and report audit to the Executive Board, study giving trends, review periodic financial statements, and approve line item changes within the budget as permitted by the Fellowship actions. The committee is to propose the Cooperative Program goal and distribution of funds and to recommend the annual goal and expenditures of the state mission offering.

Responsibilities

SECTION 6. The Executive Board is to serve as the Fellowship ad interim and as the Fellowship's principal advisory on its total program. The Executive Board shall not contravene actions or policies of the Fellowship.

SECTION 7. To serve as the Fellowship's operating board for all programs not assigned to other boards.

SECTION 8. To evaluate the performance of the Executive Director-Treasurer of the Fellowship, and to assist him in the exercise of his duties as chief executive officer and spiritual leader in carrying out the programs of the Fellowship.

SECTION 9. To act as fiduciary and fiscal agent of the Fellowship in all matters not assigned to agencies' boards, to execute any and all deeds, mortgages, deeds of trust, assignments, or other conveyance that the Executive Board may deem proper in its official capacity.

SECTION 10. The Fellowship herewith empowers and directs the Chairman of the Executive Board and its Executive Director-Treasurer to sign in official capacity for the Fellowship all such aforementioned deeds, mortgages, deeds of trust, assignments, or other conveyances.

SECTION 11. All gifts of money other than the general budget of the Fellowship or other property made to the corporation shall be disbursed according to the donor's designation. The corporation shall have the power at all times to accept or reject designated gifts. Undesignated gifts shall be distributed in accordance with the corporation's budget.

SECTION 12. To act upon the recommendations of the Nomination Committee to fill any vacancies occurring between Annual Meetings.

SECTION 13. To have oversight of the arrangements of the Fellowship sessions.

SECTION 14. To present to the Fellowship a proposed budget for the forthcoming year. The Finance Committee of the Board shall serve as the budget committee. The Executive Board shall publish and distribute to all the churches of the Fellowship copies of the proposed budget at least thirty (30) days before presenting it to the Fellowship in its Annual Session for final approval.

SECTION 15. To establish and revise policies relating to the duties assigned to the Executive Board by the Fellowship and to maintain policies manuals. The Executive Board shall work closely with the Executive Director-Treasurer to ensure an organization that is both functional and accountable. The policies manuals are subject to the review and amendment of a simple majority of the Executive Board.

SECTION 16. To be responsible for long range planning of the Fellowship and its programs and to coordinate the long range planning of an agency's board with the total Fellowship program.

SECTION 17. To assist the Finance Committee in the fulfillment of their duties, in the audit of the Fellowship's financial records, to receive and publish their reports in the Book of Reports, and to act upon their recommendations concerning the management of the accounts.

SECTION 18. To approve and to employ board approved staff personnel upon recommendation of the Executive Director-Treasurer and the Administrative/Personnel Committee. The Executive Board shall approve personnel policies.

SECTION 19. Members are expected to attend all Executive Board committee meetings and plenary sessions. Failure to do so may result in their removal by the Fellowship in session. Each member is responsible for notifying the chairman of the Executive Board or the Fellowship office in case of an emergency necessitating an absence.

Meetings

SECTION 20. The Executive Board shall meet at least three times a year on dates suggested by the Executive Director-Treasurer and approved by the Executive Board and at additional times as determined by the Board. The organizational meeting of the Executive Board shall be held following the Annual Meeting.

SECTION 21. The Executive Board may be called into special session by the Administrative/Personnel Committee.

SECTION 22. A majority of the elected Executive Board shall be considered a quorum.

Reports

SECTION 23. The Executive Board shall prepare and publish a comprehensive report of the affairs of the Fellowship and a summary of the actions taken by the Executive Board in an Annual Book of Reports.

SECTION 24. The Executive Board shall publish a summary of the Executive Board actions in the state Baptist paper after each session

ARTICLE VIII – AMENDMENTS

Amendments may be made in these Bylaws by a simple majority of the messengers present when the vote is taken without regard to total enrollment at any Annual Meeting of the Fellowship, provided (1) no amendment may be considered after the second session of the Fellowship, (2) and that the proposed change be submitted in writing to the Fellowship office and the Constitution and Bylaws Committee at least one hundred twenty (120) days prior to the Annual Meeting and published in state Baptist paper or mailed to the churches ninety (90) days prior to the Annual Meeting.

EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORT

The DSBF Executive Board met four times since our last Fellowship Annual Meeting in Sioux Falls, SD. There were three regularly scheduled meetings, and one special called meeting.

The board accepted with reluctance the resignations of Steve Osage and Joe Todd. Bro. Steve returned to Oklahoma to pastor a congregation, while Bro. Joe went back to his home state of Montana to become student director at Montana State University. We thank these fine staff members and wish them well in their new ministries.

The board accepted a staff recommendation/plan to renovate our present state convention office building and property at 2020 Lovett Avenue in Bismarck, ND. Phase One consisting of re-surfacing the parking lot and painting the building has been completed.

The board accepted a staff recommendation to realign the old Language Missions Director in light of our new Fellowship Long Range plan. The new position has expanded responsibilities and is called Church Multiplication/Language/Partnership Coordinator.

We accepted the staff's recommendation of new position descriptions for Larry Vickery and Ray Maynard effective January 1, 2001. Larry's new job description is Church Planter Coordinator, while Ray will become Eastern North Dakota Church Planter Strategist/Associational Consultant.

In our August board meeting we heard a presentation by Dr. Ricky Lee of the Arkansas Baptist State Convention after which we voted to enter into a formal mission partnership for three years beginning January 1, 2002, with a possible extension. Formal documents will be signed at our 2001 Fellowship Annual Meeting in Pierre, SD, and at the annual Arkansas Baptist State Convention meeting, this year in Russellville, AR. We look forward to having this strong state convention as our strategic mission partner.

For many years there has been interest in developing an international partnership between the Fellowship and some overseas mission location. Four Dakota Baptists spent two weeks in Ukraine this past August and early September, to investigate the possibility of a three-year mission partnership with the eight oblasts (regions) in western Ukraine. This team will be making appropriate recommendations to our board in early 2002.

Presently there is no editor for the Dakota Connection, but a process is underway to find a qualified person as soon as possible. Many thanks to Steve Dunn, pastor of Capitol Heights Baptist Church in Bismarck, ND, for the months he was able to serve in this vital role. Thanks also to Wayne James, pastor of Grace Baptist, Vermillion, who serves as webmaster for our Fellowship web page.

Executive Director's Annual Report

W.D. (Doc) Lindsey

On November 1, 2001, I will begin my fourth year as your State Executive Director. More than ever I consider it a great privilege to minister alongside you in trying to reach every Dakotan with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. These are busy days, and the future looks bright indeed as we follow the Lord's leadership. Let me update you on some of the exciting things happening in the Fellowship.

Partnership Updates

Louisiana Baptist Convention. We are blessed to have an ongoing strategic relationship with Louisiana Baptists. Several of their state staff persons and a large number of their Directors of Missions have come to the Dakotas during the past two years. Several of their state staffers have served as consultants and seminar leaders. Others have assisted our staff in the areas of strategic planning and resource utilization.

A number of our congregations have received a wide variety of assistance. This has included teams to help with building churches, VBS, surveying, pastor and wives retreats, and work with our youth. Although this is not a formal partnership yet, we praise the Lord for the willingness of our Louisiana brothers and sisters to join with us in mission across these Dakotas.

Arkansas Baptist State Convention. We will begin a formal three-year partnership with Arkansas Baptists, beginning in 2002. There will be a signing ceremony at our Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Annual meeting in Pierre, SD, October 18-19, 2001. At that time there will be discussion of the new partnership, and we will hear from some of their leaders who will be speaking at the Annual Meeting.

Arkansas Baptists are highly regarded for their experience in and commitment to missions, both at home and abroad. The state of Arkansas includes a challenging mixture of urban, suburban, and rural population centers. They are also partnering with Seattle during its Strategic Focus Cities process. In the Dakotas they have the opportunity to join with us in ministry settings quite similar to many in Arkansas. They are also particularly interested in working on our Native American reservations. In April 2001 ten Directors of Missions and two state staff persons spent nearly a week in the Dakotas, touring all association areas.

As will be seen elsewhere in this booklet, John Guillott has joined our staff. Among his major assignments will be coordinating these two state partnerships.

Ukraine. For a number of years various leaders in our Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship have wanted us to have an international partnership. Recently we have begun to focus on Ukraine, in Eastern Europe. This country of about fifty

million people is open to the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and is presently a harvest field. They are planting churches, building Bible colleges and seminaries, starting Bible studies, evangelizing, and working with orphanages. We have focused our attention on the western third of this country which is roughly the size of Texas.

During the period August 21 – September 4, 2001, our Executive Director and three other Dakotans made an exploratory trip. We went there mainly to build relationships, to meet with as many Ukrainian leaders and pastors as possible, and to see a cross section of their ministries and ministry needs. We noticed that Ukrainian Baptists and Dakota Southern Baptists have many similarities with regards to missions and evangelism. Plus they are on the plains, just like we are here. Ukraine is on about the same Latitude. Even their crops are similar.

The American team came away from the time with a distinct feeling that we should go ahead with a formal partnership, and I plan on recommending this to our Fellowship very soon. Perhaps someone from Ukraine can be with us during our 2002 Annual Meeting, set for Fargo, ND.

Building Renovation. We have completed the renovation of the exterior of our state offices in Bismarck. This included much needed black topping. We have begun work on the interior, as well, and both bathrooms have received a facelift. Special thanks go to Vicki Becker, our Office Manager, for her tireless work both in the design and with the various vendors. Thanks also to Tony Stottlemire, who did the excellent finish carpentry, and to Richard Farley, who truly did yeoman's work to get this project completed. Please drop by to see us if you are in Bismarck.

Collegiate Ministry Report

John M. Miller

Joe Todd left the Dakotas after a number of years as Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Campus Ministry Director. Joe had a heart for the campuses and we will miss his direction.

Garvon Golden will be the DSBF Collegiate Ministry Coordinator for the present time. Richard Tinsley is still active in ministry on campuses in the Rapid City area. Cory Gonyo has an active collegiate ministry at the University of South Dakota, Vermillion, SD.

There are approximately 100,000 persons enrolled on college campuses in the Dakotas. That number represents not only our future leaders but also a large percentage of who we are. This is one of the large challenges for Dakota Baptist Churches as we seek effective ways of reaching and discipling people for Christ.

A Strategy Planning Session is scheduled October 22-23, 2001 in Rapid City. John Moore, Louisiana Campus Ministry Director, will lead this conference. We will determine the future of DSBF Collegiate Ministry in the Dakotas.

Church Development—John M. Miller

Purpose: Grow healthy Dakota Churches: This will happen when church life includes a balance of worship, evangelism, discipleship, fellowship, and ministry.

Most Church Development activities are driven by field service requests from churches and associations.

I have listed some activities initiated by the DSBF to assist churches and associations in 2002:

1. We plan to **help churches know their strengths and weaknesses** by providing Natural Church Development trained consultants. This process helps a church evaluate eight quality characteristics:
Empowering Leadership; Gift-Oriented Ministry; Passionate Spirituality;
Functional Structures; Inspiring Worship Service; Holistic Small Groups;
Need-Oriented Evangelism; and Loving Relationships
2. We plan to provide two major activities to aid in **pastoral and lay leadership training**:
 1. A pastor's school April 12-13, 2002
 2. Scholarships to help pastors and lay leaders attend Green Lake Leadership Week, July 1-5, 2002
3. We plan to provide **training for associational Sunday School teams**, February 28-March 1, 2002 in Minneapolis.
4. We plan to provide **Discipleship and Family training** and material overviews as requested by associations and churches.
5. We plan to **train associational and area Stewardship** consultants September 12-13, 2001.
6. We plan to **help associations and churches know how to fill out their Annual Church Profile** as they request help. Also, we will help churches know how to use that material to understand their churches' history.
7. We plan to provide **trained Capitol Funds Development consultants** during 2002.
8. We plan to conduct a **youth DiscipleNOW, Youth Bible Drill/Speaker's Tournament** event, March 22-24, 2002, Brookings, SD.
9. We plan to conduct two **Children's Festivals, Children's Bible Drill**, May 3-4, 2002.
10. We have a good variety of printed **materials and kits that are available** to check out for a short term, within these guidelines:
 - If we have it and do not need it for a conference-you may borrow it
 - Call Lynn Metzger to check out materials
 - Materials must be returned within six weeks unless you negotiate some other period of time.
 - Any material not returned within the time limit of six weeks or time limit agreed to. Nothing more will be checked out until everything is returned.

Dakota WMU Report to Annual Meeting

We are rejoicing and celebrating the final outcome of the 2000 Baker Missions Offering. The total receipts were \$18,062.00. This is short of our goal of \$20,000, but far more than has ever been given for the Baker offering.

February brings our annual Dakota WMU Council meeting. This year we met in Bismarck at the Days Inn. Our attendance was quite low because of a snowstorm that hit South Dakota and part of North Dakota causing several of our members to have to cancel travel plans. In spite of the low attendance we had a very good meeting and were able to make some strategic decisions.

The Hills Are Alive with the Sound of Missions" took place July 12-15, 2001. It was an opportunity for women to come together for a time of learning, fellowship, worship and missions in the foothills of the Rocky Mountains. Five women from the Dakotas were able to attend. Donna Guillott was one of the conference leaders and Holly Lindsey was in charge of planning the 5 worship sessions. The event was sponsored by the WMUs of the Dakotas, Minnesota-Wisconsin, Kansas-Nebraska, Colorado, Wyoming, Montana, Utah-Idaho, Canada and WMU, SBC. About 200 women participated.

Much of the summer is taken up in planning, producing, and mailing the promotional material for the Baker Offering emphasis each September. The materials for the 2001 offering were mailed on August 2 to every congregation of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship. Our offering goal for missions and ministry projects in the Dakotas is \$25,000. Another goal is to have 100% participation by our churches.

Dot Carpenter, Dakota WMU President, accompanied me to the WMU, SBC Annual meeting in New Orleans, LA in June. One of the highlights was the performance by the Korean Baptist Children's Choir and an address by Billy Kim, president of the Baptist World Alliance. This missions celebration is always worth attending.

September 7-9 brought the RefresHer Women's Retreat to Richardton, ND. 83 women registered for the time of "Reflection". We were led in Bible Study by Ann Lawrence, WMU/Missions Ministries Director for the Baptist Convention of New England. Sally Frazier of Shreveport, LA led in worship and we were able to hear a representative share about teaching ESL classes in an Asian country.

"Touching the Heart of God" is the prayer strategy of Dakota WMU that was introduced at RefresHer. The intention of this prayer strategy is to involve women and churches in different aspects of prayer for the Dakotas and lost people around the world.

As stated in last year's report to the Fellowship, the purpose of the Dakota Connection is to feature events and activities of the Southern Baptist Convention churches in North and South Dakota.

There have been some liabilities and limitations to this process, as well. Perhaps the biggest limitation is simply that we do not have enough room to report on our work throughout the Dakotas.

Accordingly, we are presently researching other possible avenues of publishing the Connection. Some have suggested that we publish the entire paper ourselves. The problem here is that costs per copy approximately triple. Obviously this forces us to less costly and perhaps less desirable alternatives.

The biggest challenge facing us right now is the lack of an Editor. Several have worked faithfully at the task, only to have to step aside for lack of time. It is my hope that we can have a permanent Editor in the very near future.

The Church Planting Department assists local churches and associations to penetrate the Dakota's with the Gospel through establishing new congregations and mission-type churches. Strategy Planning, new work consultations, congregational assistance, and leadership training are provided for pastors, churches, and associations.

The strategy of the Church Planting Department is to assist planting indigenous, culturally relevant, mission congregations. The Church Planting Department also will assist with demographics for any local church. In 2000-01, the Church Planting Department provided supplement assistance to --- mission churches. The Church Planting Department helped with 3 major Probes this year with the results finding 102 locations where a mission-type congregation or out-reach Bible Study could be started. Larry Vickery will be coming on staff in January 2002, and begin involvement with Church Planting.

On July 1, 2001 I assumed the responsibilities of the new Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship staff position of Language Missions Director and Partnership Coordinator. I will continue to live in South Dakota and relate to eastern North and South Dakota churches in whatever way they need assistance from the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship. My family and I moved from Huron, SD to Watertown, SD and my office is located in my home.

We have been blessed with a number of mission teams from various states this summer. First Baptist, Sisseton had teams from several states helping them build an addition to their church. The building at Cannonball is still a work in progress and had several teams assisting there this summer. Dakota Baptist Church at Fort Totten also had several mission teams involved in a building project. Laplant Baptist Chapel had teams to come work on their new fellowship hall that was erected late last year.

The Indian Youth and Family camps were well attended. Both of these camps were held at Camp Lakodia near Madison, SD. There were 6 professions of faith at Youth Camp and 5 at the Family Camp. Teams from Oklahoma, Florida, North Carolina, and Texas assisted in leadership, programming, and preparing meals.

There are other language groups in the Dakotas that need to be reached. We are making plans now for LASERS (Language work probes) to be conducted in our metropolitan areas. Let us pray that God will prepare the way for the gospel to be proclaimed to people of all races and cultures that are in the Dakotas.

The Dakotas have been blessed by Southern Baptists from many different states – mission teams, pastors, lay people from all walks of life. Some of these relationships have been ongoing for several years and will continue into the future. We are beginning our third year with Louisiana Baptists who have committed to several projects.

We are on the threshold of a new formal partnership with the Arkansas Baptist State Convention. The formal signing of the partnership documents will take place this fall at our Annual Meeting and their State Convention. I will be working with their Partnership Coordinator to coordinate projects within the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship. This will be a reciprocal partnership, i.e., we will be receiving assistance from Arkansas staff, associations, and churches; and we will be enlisting people from the Dakotas to send to Arkansas to assist them with their various needs. A goal I have established is that by 2003 – each association in the Dakotas will send teams to Arkansas or some other state or country to be “on mission” – sharing our resources with those in need.

As we work together in Language Missions and Partnership opportunities, two questions we must ask ourselves in all that we do: (1) Does it help reach people for Christ? (2) Does it strengthen the local church? I look forward to this coming year – working with you – Dakota Southern Baptists.

All of the Associations with the Dakota Fellowship have completed and are in the first phase of their strategy plan. The major event in the Associations has been that the Fellowship has become field driven, and as a result the Fellowship responded with Field Service Request known as FSRs.

How to Make a Field Service Request

What is a Field Service Request?

A request for assistance from the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship office. It may be a request for training, materials, financial assistance etc.

How does a Church initiate a Field Service Request?

A standard form (Enclosed) should be filled out and sent to the Associational Missionary (or the state office) who will see if others would like to join in, or if others have made similar request. Then the request form will be sent to the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship.

Who may initiate a Field Service Request?

Any Dakota church or association.

What is important in considering a Field Service Request?

To consider how this request fits into the church, association and Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship growth strategy and priority.

What is the process that will be followed when a Field Service Request is sent?

1. The request will be generated from the field (church or association)
2. The Associational Missionary will sign the report
3. Requests will be sent to Vicki Becker (dsbf@btinet.net or P.O. Box 6028, Bismarck, ND 58506)
4. The request will be signed by the DSBF Missions Director.
5. The request will be signed by the appropriate department director.
6. The signed copy will be returned to the association and church, with the contact person on the letter.
7. Negotiations detailing the request will take place between the initiator (church or association) and the department director.

How much lead-time is needed to process a Field Service Request?

The DSBF needs at least 90 days to process the request, especially when working with other SBC entities.

What if it is an emergency?

The DSBF will handle emergency requests as rapidly as possible.

Badlands Baptist Associational Missionary's Annual Report:

I would like to thank the Badlands Association Churches and DSBF staff for the help that each contributed to the work in the Badlands. Becky and I continue to be thankful to our Lord for being able to serve in North Dakota. It is a joy that only the Lord could have provided.

All the churches in CBA currently have pastors: Rev Charles Woody resigned from Lincoln Baptist Church, Lincoln, but remained as interim. After a few months, the church asked him to resume duties as pastor. Dr. John Sneed came to serve at North Hill Baptist Church, Minot. Pastor John, wife Aleta and two children came from a pastorate in Fremont, Nebraska. Rev. Eugene Harjo came to FBC, Fort Yates. Pastor Eugene, wife Marilyn, and two children came from a pastorate in Dallas, Texas.

Three churches are in a building project. Capitol Heights Baptist Church, Bismarck, will be closed in by winter; Cannon Ball Baptist Mission, on the Standing Rock Reservation is about ready for sheet rock; Cross Roads Baptist Church, Minot, is looking to finish. All have been blessed by work parties both local and from other states, and even from Canada.

Several of our churches traveled to Rapid City to take part in their "Encounter" evangelism conference. This set the stage for our churches that participated in the "Horse Whisperer" evangelistic event. The attendance was good at Belcourt, Hazen, and New Salem. At Belcourt about 700 folks heard the Gospel through Paul Daley's presentation. Pastor Vel Hightower believes this is the largest crowd to ever hear the Gospel at one time on the Reservation. People came forward at the invitation for prayer, re-dedication, and salvation.

One hundred eight workers and children attended Children's Camp, held near Garrison, on Lake Sakakawea. A total of 26 decisions were made.

The CBA Strategy has been put into place and revised. The need was seen for more to be added and implemented. Dr. Don Maybry from Louisiana is working with us to fine-tune the process.

Dr. Bob Banks from Georgia has been doing a liability study on the association. With the report back we will digest it and see what adjustments will be needed.

Home Fires of Hope, Natural Church Development, the NET evangelism process, and Evangelism Response Center are being introduced to our churches. These are to help strengthen the membership and increase it as well. I am expecting great reports from our churches because of these.

Two of our churches have gone through Natural Church Development the first time, and it has shown areas where the church needs strengthening. In time they will be assessed again to get a new evaluation.

Seven from CBA attended LifeWay's Church Leadership Development Conference at Green Lake, Wisconsin. Everyone experienced inspirational Bible studies, challenging sermons, and informative small groups. Each returned with a new commitment to the local church.

Finally, here are some examples of ministry work that happened this year in Heartland Association. A group of 105 people came from Louisiana to work in three different locations in the Heartland Area. They did prayer walks, Backyard Bible Clubs, Vacation Bible School and a Basketball Camp. They also brought a band and youth speaker and held youth rallies in three cities. They were able to share JESUS with hundreds and there were 7 professions of faith, including someone from Louisiana. We also had a booth at the State Fair and dispensed in excess of 20,000 cups of water, during one of the hottest weeks this year. There were groups from Missouri, South Carolina, Tennessee, North Carolina, Louisiana and many others. Let's pray for the cities that have no Southern Baptist Work in them and go in and evangelize them.

A second Pastor and Wife Retreat was held in June in conjunction with the annual association picnic. This was a time of fellowship and strengthening for our people.

Grace Baptist Church in Vermillion carries out a strong student work at the university. Four students were sent as missionaries this past summer. This work is assisted financially by the association.

We presently have three churches that are without pastors. Many prospective pastors have been contacted about their availability and willingness to come to South Dakota. The search continues for the right leadership to come and stay.

Since the last annual meeting West River Association has made significant progress in several areas.

Strategic Plan: The association met as an Executive Board in May and adopted a restructuring plan. In June a revision of the Constitution & Bylaws was drafted and will be presented for adoption at the September Annual Meeting. This will formalize a Team Structure for the way the association does its work and expends its resources.

New Work: In April Don Mabry led the association in a New Work Probe. Through surveying the area and looking at a number of criteria forty-one possible new work sites were identified. Through the summer months we have prioritized those sites and are in the process of developing new work plans for each. In fact, two new mission congregations have begun. Bill Martin has started a mission congregation in Hot Springs, Joy Community Fellowship and Jeff Sackett has started a new work in Newell, the Newell Community Baptist Church. Both of these new works are sponsored by Black Hills Baptist Church in Whitewood.

Church Development: Two conferences were offered by the association to provide tools to the churches to help in church development. Natural Church Growth Development seminar was offered in May. Net Training was offered in May also. In April our women had a retreat with 60+ women in attendance. Our Youth & Children's Camp convened in June with a total of 80 campers. Charles Hall led a very able staff and the camp was one of our best. Many of our churches have enjoyed the assistance of Mission Teams for VBS, Sports Camps and Backyard Bible Clubs. At the end of June Paul Dailey's Wild Horse Demonstration was presented at Foothills Community Baptist Church and Black Hills Baptist Church. There was good attendance with 9 professions of faith and 15 other decisions.

Resource & Mission Center: A mission team from Sebring Florida spent a week constructing handicap access to our Resource & Mission Center as well as a storage building. This will enable the mission center to have more space to house resources for our churches.

Partnerships: In September we had pastors from Florida in a association leading bible studies and preaching revivals. Our Partnership with South Florida Baptist Association in Lakeland continues and we look forward to cultivating and strengthening other partnerships as well.

We welcome Bob and Jenny Farmer as the new pastor at Rapid Valley Baptist Church and Harvey Sylvester as interim pastor at Northern Hills Baptist Church in Spearfish.

CONSTITUTION of the DAKOTA SOUTHERN BAPTIST FELLOWSHIP FOUNDATION

Article I. NAME

This Foundation shall be called the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Foundation.

Article II. MEMBERSHIP

The sole member of the Foundation is the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship.

Article III. PURPOSE

This Foundation is organized, and will always operate, exclusively for religious purposes, and no part of the net earning of this corporation inure, or will ever inure, to the benefit of any individual or of any private shareholder, there being no shareholders. None of the income of this organization may inure to the benefit of any private individual or members and the assets of the Foundation are irrevocably dedicated to and for religious purposes, and upon dissolution of the Foundation, all of its property and affairs shall be liquidated in such manner as deemed advisable and advantageous by the Fellowship Executive Director, the Foundation Board of Directors and the Fellowship Executive Board. Property and proceeds of such liquidation shall be turned over to the Southern Baptist Foundation of Nashville, Tennessee, or its successor, or, if there be no such successor, then to the Executive Committee of the Southern Baptist Convention.

Article IV. OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of the Foundation shall be an Executive Director, President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer.

Section 2. The Executive Director of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship shall be the Executive Director of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Foundation.

Article V. DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors of the Foundation shall be six (6) elected by the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship and serve in accordance with the Foundation ByLaws.

Article VI. FOUNDATION CONTRIBUTIONS AND FUNDS

Section 1. All restricted and unrestricted capital (corpus) funds will be raised by voluntary investments of individuals, groups, corporations, and churches. Additional funds received by the Foundation from the sale and/or use of property by bequest shall become restricted or unrestricted capital (corpus) funds. All monetary funds received by the Foundation by bequest shall become restricted or unrestricted capital (corpus) funds. Undesignated funds received shall be unrestricted capital (corpus), designated funds received shall be restricted capital (corpus).

Section 2. All restricted capital (corpus) funds shall be invested in safe interest/dividend bearing bank accounts, Government Bonds, or Annuity Programs. All investments must be AA rating or better.

Section 3. All unrestricted capital (corpus) if invested shall be invested in safe interest/dividend bearing bank accounts, Government Bonds, or Annuity Programs. All investments must be AA rating or better. Church loans may be authorized. The total of all church loans shall not exceed ten percent (10%) of the unrestricted capital (corpus).

Section 4. The investment of capital funds shall be managed by the Executive Director with concurrence of the Board of Directors of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Foundation.

Section 5. Funds from the Foundation's investments of designated investments shall be used strictly according to the expressed will and direction of the donor.

Section 6. Funds from the Foundation's investments of undesignated investments shall be used to accomplish the stated purpose of the Foundation. Any distribution of funds recommended by the Executive Director of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Foundation must have concurrence of the majority of the Foundation Board of Directors.

BYLAWS of the DAKOTA SOUTHERN BAPTIST FELLOWSHIP FOUNDATION

ARTICLE I. TERRITORY

Section 1. The territory to be served by the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Foundation is North Dakota, South Dakota and other areas.

Section 2. The principle office of the Foundation shall be in the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship office in Bismarck, North Dakota.

ARTICLE II. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The Executive Director of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship shall be the Executive Director of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Foundation.

Section 2. The Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Nominating Committee shall recommend ministers and laity to the Fellowship to serve as directors of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Foundation.

Section 3. There shall be at least six (6) members elected by the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship to serve as directors of the Foundation in annual meeting of the Fellowship. These shall be elected in accordance with the Constitution and Bylaws governing the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship.

Section 4. Elected members of the Foundation shall be maintained on a rotation basis with one-third (1/3) serving a one (1) year term, one-third (1/3) serving a two (2) year term, and one-third (1/3) serving a three (3) year term.

Section 5. The term of office for members of the Foundation shall be three (3) years. No member shall serve more than six (6) years until one (1) year has lapsed.

Section 6. Should vacancies occur for any and all reasons, on the Foundation Board, the Fellowship Nominating Committee shall bring recommendations to the Executive Board of the Fellowship to fill such vacancies until the next regular session of the Fellowship.

Section 7. The Board of Directors of the Foundation, at a special meeting called specifically for such purpose may, by majority vote recommend to the Executive Board of Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship the removal from office any one (1) or more of the directors.

Section 8. The Foundation shall organize itself by the election of a president, a vice-president, a secretary, and a treasurer immediately following the annual meeting. The said officers shall serve for one (1) year and subject to reelection by the Board each year, serve for not more than three (3) years in any office. Removal of any officer during the normal business year shall be by majority vote of the Board of Directors at any regular or special meeting of the Board. Any two (2) offices may be held by the same person except that one (1) person may not simultaneously hold the offices of president and secretary.

Section 9. The Foundation shall organize committees as is necessary for the fulfillment of its responsibilities and determine the authority of each committee.

Section 10. Each member of the Foundation shall be a member of a Southern Baptist church which is in cooperation with the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship.

Section 11. A quorum at all meetings of the Board of Directors of the Foundation shall consist of a simple majority of the membership of the Board. A smaller number may, however, adjourn a meeting without further notice, until a quorum be secured. The act of a majority of the directors present at any meeting at which there is a quorum, shall be the act of the Board of Directors, except as otherwise provided by Statute or the Certificate of Incorporation.

Section 12. Regular meetings of the Board shall be held bi-annually at a time and place agreed on by the directors.

Section 13. Special meetings of the Board may be called at any time by the Executive Director of the Foundation, the President of the Board, or any three (3) Board members. Special meetings of the Board shall require a five-day (5) notice, given by phone, telegram, in person, in writing, or otherwise.

Section 14. The Board of Directors may, by resolutions adopted by the majority of members of the Board, designate two (2) or more directors to constitute an Executive Committee, which to the extent provided by resolutions, shall have authority to act with the authority of the Board of Directors in certain matters of management of the Foundation.

Section 15. Directors may receive reimbursements, deemed reasonable by the Board of Directors, for travel, food and lodging expenses incurred while attending regular meetings and/or special meetings of the Board of Directors in conducting the business of the Foundation.

ARTICLE III. OFFICERS

Section 1. The elective officers of the Foundation shall be a president, one (1) vice-president, a secretary, and a treasurer as described in Article II - Section 8.

Section 2. The Executive Director of the Board shall be the chief executive officer of the Foundation and officers and agents shall respectively exercise and perform such powers, duties, and functions as are generally exercised by like officers in corporate affairs, and as may be directed by the Board of Directors.

Section 3. The authority under which conveyances or encumbrances of all or any part of the corporate property may be made shall be by resolution of the Board of Directors. The persons who shall be authorized to execute the instruments of conveyance or encumbrance shall be the Executive Director, the President, the Vice-president or the Secretary.

ARTICLE IV. FINANCE

Section 1. The monies of the Foundation shall be deposited in the name of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Foundation in such bank or banks or trust company of trust companies or saving institutions as the Board of Directors shall designate in keeping with the desires of the donors of said monies, and may be drawn out only on checks signed in the name of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Foundation by such person or persons that the Board of Directors, by appropriate resolution may direct. Notes and commercial paper, when authorized by the Board, shall be signed in the name of the Foundation by such officer or agent or agents as authorized by the Board.

Section 2. The Board of Directors determine the rate of interest to be paid on restricted capital (corpus)

by averaging the interest received from the many various investment accounts.

Section 3. The Board of Directors shall manage the proceeds from the investments of unrestricted capital (corpus) to meet the purposes for which the Foundation was established.

Section 4. The Board of Directors shall have authority to make loans to churches for construction of, repair of, and additions to, new or existing buildings such loans shall not exceed ninety percent (90%) of the unrestricted capital (corpus). The rate of interest charged for such loans shall be determined by the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall make a report of activities to the annual meeting of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship.

ARTICLE V. WAIVER OF NOTICE, ACTION WITHOUT MEETING

Section 1. Any member or director may waive, in writing, any notice required to be given him/her under these bylaws, whether before, at, or after the time stated therein.

Section 2. Any action which may be taken at a meeting of the directors may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed by all of the directors entitled to vote with respect to the subject matter thereof.

ARTICLE VI. VOTING

Section 1. At each meeting of the Board of Directors of this Foundation, each Board member shall be entitled to one (1) vote.

Section 2. There shall be no proxy voting.

ARTICLE VII. SEAL

The Board of Directors shall provide a corporate seal, which shall be circular in form and shall be inscribed thereon the name of the Foundation and the words "Corporate Seal."

ARTICLE VIII. AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws may be changed at any Annual Meeting of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship. The Foundation Board of Directors may make any suggestion of change to the Constitution Committee of the Executive Board of the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship.

Recommendation concerning changes shall come to the Fellowship through the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship Executive Board.
